In June we went to the To the North Market. It was great to see a client running our apple stall and taking home some of the profits. This is just one story of how clients in our employment program are achieving outcomes and getting out in the community. This client is now going to sell apples at other markets!

In my new role as State Chairperson of the NDS (National Disability Services) I appeared before the Tasmanian Legislative Council's enquiry into the State disability service. We talked about how it is hard for people to get onto the NDIS, how we lack a depth of services outside of the cities, and how State government services need to be more accessible.

Back in the Nexus office we ran more COVID vaccination hubs for all staff and clients who wanted a vaccination. I appreciate that families and staff are taking this very seriously and continue to support us to reach our target of having the majority of staff fully vaccinated by October. We have another COVID clinic starting on 17 September.

We are looking forward to the next few months heading into the tail end of this year as we launch more programs and support more Tasmanians.

The Huonville office will also be home to our sister organisation, Social Enterprise, Employment and Diversity (SEED) which will be providing a tailored employment program to people living with disability.



Nexus COVID Vaccinations Hub







Through winter we worked with the federal government and Aspen Medical to provide our staff with the opportunity to get the COVID19 vaccination onsite at our offices in TechnoPark.

Across three hubs we had over 100 staff vaccinated and were able to offer doses to our neighbours at Able Tasmania.

We are working hard to get our clients access to the vaccinations, and this is underway both in and out of our supported living houses. It was great for our staff to be able to add this additional layer of protection for clients, colleagues and themselves.

Training with Women's Legal Aid

Our board member, Deb Bailey, is the Principal Solicitor at Women's Legal Service Tasmania Inc and came into our office to speak with staff about the legal framework around reporting abuse. She provided valuable resources for better supporting clients who are experiencing abuse and sexual violence.

A 2021 report commissioned by the Disability Royal Commission revealed that, in 2020, women with disability were more than twice as likely to report sexual violence as women without disability. We want to make sure all of our staff feel well equipped and confident in supporting clients who may have had these experiences.

Alison has been working with our capacity building team to bake lots of lovely things including muffins and this delicious chocolate cake.


Alison is taking lots of photos of her creations so she can add them to her Nexus photo album that she is creating with staff.
