Nexus Inc is looking for community minded individuals to join our voluntary board.

Established in 1998, Nexus is a disability support service based in Southern Tasmania with a reputation for providing quality support to people living with a range of disabilities and support needs.

We provide over 300 people with both traditional and innovative services that support them to:

- Live more independently in traditional supported accommodation, innovative housing models or their own home.
- Build capacity in everyday skills and to prepare for major life transitions such as leaving school, moving out of home and starting work.
- Gain work skills and employment through a range of associated social enterprises.
- Access their communities to improve social interaction and develop life skills.
- Achieve their personal goals whilst managing their mental and physical health.
- Get allied health assessments and support.

At Nexus we continue to monitor, and provide for, the changing needs of the sector.

Our services are supported by over 500 staff who provide 24/7 support across our services.

Our funding comes primarily from the National Disability Insurance Scheme (NDIS) with a turnover exceeding \$35m.

Nexus is overseen by a volunteer, skills based community Board of governance who meet 8-10 times annually. They are supported by a Finance and Audit Subcommittee and a Program Governance Subcommittee, which both include independent members.

The Board includes members with professional and personal experience across a wide range of areas including business, policy, corporate governance, mental health, media, law, finance and the disability sector.

The Board is developing a new strategic plan for the 2024-2027 period. The previous plan focused on building capacity and awareness, growing the number of clients we support, broadening our service offering, and building processes for client feedback. The Board remains committed to building business systems, developing staff capacity to deliver quality services, and maintaining financial security.

The Board is seeking applicants with strong governance skills and welcomes applications from people with skills in medical/health, community sector, policy and funding, and commercial strategy. We encourage people with disability knowledge, and particularly those with lived experience, to apply.
