Even physical design can promote Active Support and we thank Homes Tasmania for partnering with us to refurbish kitchens in two of our North West properties. The new kitchens support clients to help with meal preparation and chat about their days.

This Summer I have been busy working on Board development. As a not for profit organisation, having a skilled volunteer Board is very important. We were overwhelmed by the quality of applications we received for our Board vacancies and were pleased to fill all positions and also be able to forward plan for future roles. Summer also saw us preparing for our new Strategic Plan, with several workshops and papers shared with the Board and Management which provided useful context to make informed decisions about the direction of Nexus.

As we head into a Federal Election this year I would like to echo the wish list of our peak body, NDS, who are calling on the Government to commit to:

- · Registration of all workers and organisations who deliver services
- · Tiered pricing to support quality and complex service provision
- · An independent pricing authority (like the Health and Aged Care sectors have)
- · Sufficient funding to provide staff with good wages, training and support.

We are hopeful for a positive outcome in achieving these important reforms to the NDIS for the continued benefit of Tasmanians living with disability.

Clients were pleased to share with guests the opportunities that their updated kitchen offers.

"I have more room to move around, and I am enjoying making my Sunday roasts in the new kitchen now," Frances, one of the residents told the guests from Nexus and Homes Tasmania.

Another client was thrilled when they saw the renovated property for the first time. "Oh my goodness, it's all new, new everything, I love it!" they said.

Nexus Team Leader, Louise, said the spaces created through the renovations are "definitely a winner".

"Our fresh and new open kitchen is already helping clients to be as independent as possible and allows them to use their different capabilities," - Louise

The house now features a brand-new kitchen, new furniture and other general improvements. The property did not originally have a dedicated staff office or sleepover room - this has also been fixed in the upgrades. Other properties in the region are also getting a much needed upgrade.

After beginning service in the North West Tasmania in 2023, we implemented a WHS review at all sites. This resulted in a renovation program to update the existing Supported Living houses to better meet the unique needs of our clients and enable staff to support them to live the life they choose.

"This renovation is a great example of how our clients are engaged and actively contribute to shaping the way they live their lives," Nexus CEO Mark Jessop said.


End of Year Fun for Capacity Building Team
